



Rules and Regulations

To maintain a good spirit and high standards, we have developed these general rules of conduct for each sponsor and each camper.

1. Medications, Alcohol, and Tobacco products

Do not bring alcoholic beverages, tobacco, or other controlled substances to camp. All prescription medicines must be monitored by an adult representative from the camper's home church. Campers must turn medications in to the camp nurse.

2. Behavior

Our camp atmosphere encourages individuals to participate in all activities with an attitude which will support the total group spirit. Campers are expected to be courteous and respectful at all time and to participate in all events.

3. Accidental or Deliberate Damage

Any damage to the camp or other camper's personal items will be repaired or replaced, as needed, and will be paid for by those responsible for the damage.

4. Physical Contact

Campers are to exhibit self-control. There is to be no physical contact between male and female campers. There will not be contact between campers of the same gender, even if it is of a playful nature. Campers are not allowed to be in areas labeled "off limits." These areas will be specified at orientation.

5. Electronics

Cellular phones, radios, walkie-talkies, televisions, laptops, magazines, handheld games or music players are to be left at home. If brought to camp, they will be turned over to the camp staff and returned upon departure.

6. Men's Dress Code

Cut offs and shorts are to be used for sleeping and swimming only. Please do not pack see-through or mesh-like material shirts, sleeveless shirts, or shirts with worldly pictures or emblems. Sweat pants are allowed only in the dorm. Earrings or necklaces are not allowed.

Snow and Junior Camp: Please pack a set of dress clothes, including a collared shirt and dress pants, for the Friday evening service.

Senior Camp: Dress clothes are to be brought and worn at each evening service.

7. Ladies' Dress Code

Only modest, loose-fitting tops, blouses, skirts, and skirt-type culottes are allowed, including during outdoor activities. Trousers of any style, mini-skirts, or sleeveless tops are not allowed. We ask that a long shirt be worn over any swim attire.

Snow and Junior Camp: Please pack a set of dress clothes, including a knee length skirt and modest blouse, for the Friday evening service. For Snow Camp's outdoor activities, culottes or skirts must be worn over snow pants, leggings, etc.

Senior Camp: Dress clothes are to be brought and worn at each evening service.

8. Rule Enforcement

We ask all campers and sponsors to fully support the camp staff. Unruly campers or sponsors will be dealt with and may be asked to leave camp. Any violation of the rules will be dealt with Scripturally, according to the discretion of the staff.

9. Age of Campers

Junior Campers: Completed third grade and no older than 13.

Senior and Snow Campers: 7th grade through 12th grade. No younger, no older.

10. Don't Forget:

Camp is a fun time that can last in hearts for a lifetime. We want each camper to enjoy themselves, but remind you that we place a strong emphasis on Bible Salvation and Spiritual growth.
